CHURCH HISTORY

Peak City Full Gospel Baptist Church was forged by God and founded by Pastor JT and Evangelist Lakithia Chapman on May 1, 2016. The first worship service was held at the Apex Community Center 53 Hunter Street Apex, NC. Over 150 persons gathered to share in this new worship effort. Dr. John T Chapman preached the first sermon at Peak City FGBC entitled, “Let the Healing Begin.” A reflection of God’s favor, the first worship service was adorned with uplifting praise and worship, attentive ushers, melodies from the Peak City Choir concluding with worshipers partaking of the Lord’s Supper. After the first worship service ended, the gatherers visited a 10,000 plus square foot property located at 1701 Center Street in Apex NC. A week later, this location would become the first home of Peak City Full Gospel Baptist Church. While new members worked diligently on the renovations of the new property, worship was conducted at the Hilton Garden Inn on Columbus Drive in Cary NC. The first worship service in the new edifice was held on May 22nd, 2016. The attendance and excitement continues to grow with each passing week. The church considers this new ministry as the Lord’s doing. To God be the Glory for the things He has done. The best is yet to come!

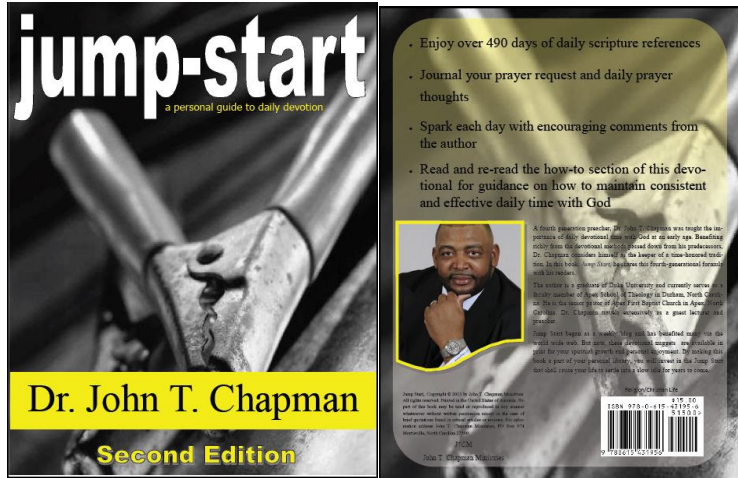

Moreover, it has almost become in vogue to be negative. Lamenting about our jobs, financial condition, health and growing older are typically at the center of many of people's negative comments. Some even think that by speaking negatively it announces to the world a refusal to be fooled into thinking that something good could ever happen. Don't fall for it child of God! That's exactly how those who are disconnected from God think. You must view the pressures to remain negative as an enemy to your peace. You should say no! I am not displeased with my life for it is the gift of God. No! I will not declare health challenges no matter how many of birthdays come and go. No! I love my spouse no matter who thinks it's cute to verbally discount and disqualify theirs. No! I will not speak words of despair regarding my job. This is one of the avenues God uses to bless my family, my church and me. No! I will not be critical of my church. It is a blessing to my spirit and me. NO! NO! NO! Negativity will not be my bread. What God says about me is the only thing that matters.

Stay Positive! - (KJV)

Monday: Romans 8: 25-28:

- 25. But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it.
- 26. Likewise, the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.
- 27. And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.
- 28. And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

Tuesday: 2 Corinthians 5: 1-7:

- For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.
- 2. For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven:
 - 3. If so be that being clothed we shall not be found naked.
 - 4. For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life.

5. Now he that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God, who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit.
6. Therefore we are always confident, knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord:
7. (For we walk by faith, not by sight :)

Wednesday: Psalms 118: 8-24:

8. It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in man.
9. It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in princes.
10. All nations compassed me about: but in the name of the Lord will I destroy them.
11. They compassed me about; yea, they compassed me about: but in the name of the Lord I will destroy them.
12. They compassed me about like bees: they are quenched as the fire of thorns: for in the name of the Lord I will destroy them.
13. Thou hast thrust sore at me that I might fall: but the Lord helped me.
14. The Lord is my strength and song, and is become my salvation.
15. The voice of rejoicing and salvation is in the tabernacles of the righteous: the right hand of the Lord doeth valiantly.
16. The right hand of the Lord is exalted: the right hand of the Lord doeth valiantly.
17. I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord.
18. The Lord hath chastened me sore: but he hath not given me over unto death.
19. Open to me the gates of righteousness: I will go into them, and I will praise the Lord:
20. This gate of the Lord, into which the righteous shall enter.
21. I will praise thee: for thou hast heard me, and art become my salvation.
22. The stone which the builders refused is become the head stone of the corner.
23. This is the Lord's doing; it is marvellous in our eyes.
24. This is the day which the Lord hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.

Thursday: Psalms 1: 1-6:

1. Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.
2. But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.
3. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.
4. The ungodly are not so: but are like the chaff which the wind driveth away.
5. Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.
6. For the Lord knoweth the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish.

Friday: Romans 8: 31-39:

31. What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us?
32. He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?
33. Who shall lay any thing to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifieth.

34. Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.
35. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?
36. As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.
37. Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.
38. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come,
39. Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Saturday: Philippians 4: 6-13:

6. Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
7. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.
8. Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things.
9. Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you.
10. But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly, that now at the last your care of me hath flourished again; wherein ye were also careful, but ye lacked opportunity.
11. Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content.
12. I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.
13. I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

Sunday: James 1: 2-9:

2. My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations;
3. Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience.
4. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.
5. If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.
6. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed.
7. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord.
8. A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.
9. Let the brother of low degree rejoice in that he is exalted:
